WHAT is the **Safe Driving Summit**?

The Safe Driving Summit is a day-long event that shows you first-hand the dangers of distracted, impaired and unsafe driving.

You will hear a keynote presentation from Mike Lutzenkirchen, who lost his son Philip Lutzenkirchen as a passenger in a distracted, impaired and unsafe driving crash. Additionally, you will hear from representatives from the Georgia Department of Transportation and first responders as they walk through their role as they arrive on the scene of a crash.

1 Choices Behind the Wheel: To the ER and Beyond

This breakout session walks through the steps a trauma team will take to save the life of a teen driver who was in a crash. There is an actor to play the driver, fake blood, a helicopter scene and real nurses and doctors that will act out the steps they take to save a teen driver's life.

2 Knowing Your Law Enforcement Agencies: State, County, and City

This interactive breakout session allows law enforcement officers from all agencies to speak with you about their roles, the crashes they have seen on the roads and the importance of driving safely, unimpaired and distraction-free. This session is interactive and allows you to have conversations and ask questions to law enforcement officers.

3 Share the Road: Get to Know Big Trucks

J & M Tankline brings their big trucks for you to sit in and see all of the blind spots truck drivers experience on the roads. This breakout session aims to educate you on how to drive safely next to and behind big trucks on the road. You can also blow the truck's horn while in the driver's seat.

4 Road to Recovery

In this session students will learn about the consequences of trauma as a result of distracted, impaired and unsafe driving: traumatic brain injury and spinal cord injury. Students will actively participate in rehabilitation activities to gain an understanding of some of the challenges faced as they navigate the rehab process.

“It really motivates you to stay safe to take everything seriously,” said Nate Hayes, Effingham County High School junior. “To do all the necessary precautions.”

“I think this is very important to show how even those couple of seconds that you're just looking at your phone and not the road can be very crucial and can affect you for the rest of your life,” said Siddhi Patel, Richmond Hill High School senior.
